5. REPORTS/DISCUSSION

A. Review 5-Year TIP

Ruthanne Taylor Berger reported that the attachments the Northwest Zone has before them are the list of recommended projects and 5-Year forecast for approval.

Ernie Reyna reviewed the 5-Year forecast and carryover revenues, which WRCOG staff reviews annually and posts quarterly. Mr. Reyna explained that for every year thereafter 2% is added to the revenue forecast. The carryover revenue is left over from the year prior.

Ms. Taylor Berger reported that the Northwest Zone TAC requested to transfer \$500k to WRCOG Administration due to significant legal expenses.

The Northwest Zone TAC reviewed the proposed projects.

Patricia Romo reported that money was moved from Archibald (River Road) Bridge into the Magnolia Avenue Grade Separation Lincoln to Buchanan project for construction.

Robert Van Zanten reported the Magnolia Avenue Grade Separation project is complete and the City is currently getting reimbursed.

Ms. Taylor Berger discussed the 10% reimbursement tracking spreadsheet, which sets aside 10% forecasted revenue for developer projects. Two projects listed are Van Buren Boulevard and Schleisman Road. If the reimbursement pot gets too large and there are no developer reimbursement projects, staff transfers about two-thirds of the money and advances it into the Zone jurisdiction projects.
