M/S/A (Magee/Jeffries) 5-0-0; Item 4.A was approved by a unanimous vote of those members present.

#### 5. REPORTS/DISCUSSION

#### A. Review 5-Year TIP

Ruthanne Taylor Berger reported a change on the attachment that went out with the agenda, from today's Southwest Zone Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting. The TAC recommended adding Railroad Canyon Road/I-15 Interchange to the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and funding \$1M of Right-of-Way for Fiscal Years 2014/2015 – 2015/2016. The cities of Temecula, Wildomar and the County of Riverside, reduced funding from their projects to provide the seed money.

Ms. Taylor Berger reported that the Southwest Zone TAC recommended transferring \$500k to WRCOG Administration due to an unanticipated draw on the reserve for legal expenses.

Mayor Bob Magee, City of Lake Elsinore, thanked staff for adding the Railroad Canyon Road project and wanted to discuss adding Grand Avenue next year to the TIP. The Southwest Zone Committee concurred that the Zone TAC should review Grand Avenue in the next TIP cycle.

Supervisor Kevin Jeffries, District 1, asked Juan Perez, TLMA Director, about Indian Truck Trail/I-15 Interchange and its cost. Mr. Perez responded that the project is done and the TIP is reimbursing the County for local funds used to front load the project.

Ms. Taylor Berger mentioned that the Southwest Zone TAC is looking to approve the list of projects; the Zone has two projects that have scored well in the Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) Call for Projects (Call), which may result in freeing up zone dollars. The Zone TAC is requesting that if the two projects are funded through RCTC's Call, that the Zone TAC be authorized to reallocate the funds to the approved list of projects.

Councilman Lane asked if the Southwest Zone funding from the two RCTC projects comes back to WRCOG and the Southwest Zone TAC meets to discuss where the funds will be allocated within the Southwest Zone, does the Zone Committee need to meet again? Ms. Taylor Berger answers that it is not required if the Zone Committee authorizes the Zone TAC to reallocate. If no changes occur, the approved TIP will go forward to the Special WRCOG Executive Committee meeting on January 6, 2014.

Supervisor Jeffries stated if there is a recommendation by the Zone TAC to reallocate funds, the Zone Committee should meet and approve it. The Zone Committee concurred and agreed to meet in January if the Zone TAC has a new recommendation.

#### Actions:

- 1. Approved the Fiscal Year 2013/2014 2017/2018 forecast.
- 2. Reviewed and took action regarding the City of Lake Elsinore's request to add Railroad Canyon Road Interchange to the Proposed Southwest Zone 2014 Transportation Improvement Program.
